### **Discussion Summary:**

- Visibility and Welcoming Environment: Roxane emphasized the need for greater visibility and representation of Indigenous culture on campus to create a welcoming environment. Suggestions included murals, a teaching lodge, and other eye-catching elements.
- Indigenous Athletes and Coaches: Highlighted the importance of promoting Indigenous athletes and coaches to attract Indigenous students. Discussed creating dedicated spaces for Indigenous students in recreational facilities.
- **Outreach and Engagement:** Roxane shared her efforts in presenting to schools, including Indigenous-focused ones. The committee discussed the need for Indigenous-focused programs and more local recruitment initiatives.
- **Community Involvement:** Proposed forming a subcommittee for outreach, hosting community events, and involving local Indigenous communities. Suggested workshops, tours, and skills camps with Indigenous athletes.
- Faculty Engagement and Policies: Stressed the need for faculty involvement and supportive policies for Indigenous practices like smudging. Discussed the importance of including Indigenous content in strategic plans and quality assurance processes.
