With the support of a \$5M investment from The Cowan Foundation, Conestoga has launched a comprehensive initiative to build capacity and quality in the seniors care workforce. The Cowan Foundation has been a catalyst for change for the PSW initiative. Conestoga provides local access to integrated, flexible, high quality education and training opportunities for PSWs. Conestoga has involved employees in long-term care (LTC), retirement homes, hospital, home and community settings.

With a strong emphasis on remote simulation learning through state-of-the-art technologies, PSW programming is delivered locally through the ONtario Sites for Integrated Training and Experiential learning (ONSITE) model, with Conestoga's renowned Cowan Health Sciences Centre serving as the epicentre. The ONSITE model allows our faculty to deliver the PSW Program through virtual delivery, with ONSITE labs hosted at specific locations in our region. This unique ONSITE delivery approach brings health-care education and training to our local communities and is designed to avoid any COVID-19 related barriers to education.

Regional delivery, flexible programming and a full range of student supports removes barriers to education, providing new opportunities for traditionally underserved populations to start on the path to successful and meaningful careers.

The work that PSWs do and the care they provide seniors are very important. Conestoga has and will continue to be a political advocate and leader for increased PSW wages and full-time work. Ensuring PSWs are given opportunities to work in full-time positions with fair wages will increase retention of these essential workers and thereby enhance the quality of care provided to seniors.





PSW PROGRAM 5



Conestoga's PSW Program Overview

As a member of an interprofessional health-care team, a Personal Support Worker (PSW) provides supportive person-centered care to individuals and families, at various levels of health and well-being, in a variety of care environments including long-term, community and/or hospital care settings. Conestoga's PSW program prepares students to become preferred graduates for the profession, armed with the skills, knowledge and understanding to truly make a difference in the lives of others.

Students will progress from beginning engagement to an entry-to-practice prepared professional PSW; one who participates in the delivery of care as directed by the plan of care/service plan with activities of daily living, comprising personal care, home management and nutrition and family responsibilities.

Throughout the program, students learn how to promote a comfortable and safe environment for all clients including those experiencing responsive behaviours, risk for injury and/or clients requiring end-of-life care. Provincially recognized certificates related to these areas of learning will be received. Experiential learning, which is central to Conestoga's program, is integrated throughout to support student application of knowledge, skills and judgment. Students are given the opportunity to study at multiple locations including the Living Classroom.

The Living Classroom is an innovative curriculum delivery model, combining classroom and real-life experiences for students to build increased knowledge and confidence working with older clients and care teams through the immediate integration of learning in long-term care and retirement living environments.

The PSW program is available full-time, part-time, and fast delivery. All locations include remote (virtual) delivery with in-person labs and field placement at multiple locations including Kitchener-Doon, Waterloo (University Gates), Guelph (Riverside Glen), Mount Forest (Strathcona), Ingersoll, Stratford and Brantford.

PSW Curriculum:

Regular paced PSW programming (full-time or part-time delivery):

8 months duration (approximately 600 hours).

FAST delivery:

21-week accelerated (the full PSW program offered in an intense full-time format, about 30+ hours/week).

PSW ONSITE delivery:

Regular paced PSW programming within the context of the LTC home, retirement home, or home care space, integrated with the opportunity to learn from patients, the team and family members.








